Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 31 December 2025

1. REPORTING ENTITY

The financial statements presented here are for the Women's Rights Party.

Women's Rights Party is an unincorporated organisation, which exists to pursue political objectives.

These financial statements were authorised for issue by the Council on the date indicated on page 4.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

a) Statement of compliance

The special purpose financial statements have been prepared for the purposes of meeting the organisations internal use and should not be relied upon for any other purpose.

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of this Statement of Financial Performance and Statement of Financial Position on a historical cost basis are followed, unless otherwise stated in the Specific Accounting Policies.

b) Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in New Zealand Dollars (\$), which is the functional and presentation currency, rounded to the nearest dollar.

3. SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Party and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duty.

Expenses

Expenses have been classified on their business nature.

Inventory

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Opening stock has been used as closing stock per section EB 23 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

Income Tax

Women's Rights Party is not subject to income tax on donations and memberships pursuant to the Income Tax Act 2007, except for section DV8 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

Goods and Services Tax

The Women's Rights Party is not registered for GST. Therefore amounts recorded in the Performance report are inclusive of GST (if any).

Changes in accounting policy

This is the second year of existence. The accounting policies are consistent throughout the year.
