

MAKING A DONATION PROTECTED FROM DISCLOSURE TO A REGISTERED POLITICAL PARTY

Section 208A-G of the Electoral Act 1993

PART A

This type of donation is for any person who wants to make a donation of more than \$1,500 to a political party and does not want their identity to be disclosed to either the public or to the party receiving the donation.

The Electoral Commission puts your donation together with others and passes it to the party at regular intervals.

Please note that:

- the maximum amount that an individual or body can donate to any one party through this process is \$46,822.50 between two successive elections (but you may donate to more than one party in this way, and to a \$46,822.50 limit for each)
- no party may receive more than \$312,150 from donations protected from disclosure between two successive elections.

If this donation or contribution takes an individual or party over their limit then we will return the excess.

Confidentiality

It is an offence under the Electoral Act 1993 to tell the party or anyone else that you intended to, or have made, this donation or to provide such information that may allow them to deduce that you intended to, or have made, this donation.

Offence provisions also apply to people permitted to know this information. The only people permitted to know this information are:

- a member or employee or other person engaged by the Electoral Commission
- any officer, employee, relative, adviser, or agent of the donor or contributor
- any other person to whom the identifying details must be supplied to enable the donation to be made (e.g. an employee of a bank who processes a cheque by which the donation is made)
- any person to whom the identifying details must be supplied to comply with one or more
 of the Inland Revenue Acts (within the meaning of section 3(1) of the Tax Administration
 Act 1994)
- the Auditor-General
- any other person entitled to the information in question in accordance with any search warrant, summons, or any process under rules of Court, or in the course of any proceedings.

The details of those who make a donation protected from disclosure, including all contributions to a donation, cannot be supplied under the Official Information Act 1982.

Privacy Statement

The Electoral Commission uses any personal information you provide on the preceding form solely to administer the "donations protected from disclosure" provisions of the Electoral Act 1993. Any donor or contributor may, under the provisions of the Privacy Act 1993, request access to and correction of their personal information held by the Electoral Commission.
