


Customer Services




Severe Weather Outlook

A cold front and associated rain-band are expected to move northwards over New Zealand on Thursday and early Friday. A strong northwest flow precedes the front, and a colder southwest flow follows it. There is moderate confidence that rainfall amounts will reach warning criteria about Fiordland and Central/Southern Westland (especially about the ranges), and low confidence about Buller and Kahurangi National Park.

There is also low confidence that the northwesterlies ahead of the front will reach severe gale for a time about Otago, Southland and southern Fiordland late Wednesday and Thursday, about inland Canterbury and Kaikoura on Thursday, and about Cook Strait, Wairarapa, Tararua District and Central Hawke's Bay on Thursday and early Friday. Additionally. there is low confidence of westerly or southwesterly winds reaching severe gale for a time about coastal Otago and Southland later Thursday (and possibly early Friday) behind the front.

On Saturday, another cold front will approach the southern South Island, and there is low confidence of northwesterlies rising to severe gale again about exposed parts of southern Fiordland, Southland and inland Otago during the day.






Severe Weather Outlook

A cold front and associated rain-band are expected to move northwards over New Zealand on Thursday and early Friday. A strong northwest flow precedes the front, and a colder southwest flow follows it. There is moderate confidence that rainfall amounts will reach warning criteria about Fiordland and Central/Southern Westland (especially about the ranges), and low confidence about Buller and Kahurangi National Park.

There is also low confidence that the northwesterlies ahead of the front will reach severe gale for a time about Otago, Southland and southern Fiordland late Wednesday and Thursday, about inland Canterbury and Kaikoura on Thursday, and about Cook Strait, Wairarapa, Tararua District and Central Hawke's Bay on Thursday and early Friday. Severe Weather Outlook


A cold front moves northwards over New Zealand on Thursday and Friday, preceded by a strong northwesterly flow, and followed by colder southwesterlies. Severe Weather Warnings and Watches have been issued for this event, and this extends into Friday morning for gale or severe gale northwesterlies about the lower North Island. Consequently, there is a moderate risk of severe gale northwesterlies about Marlborough, Wellington, Wairarapa, Tararua District and Central Hawkes Bay on Friday morning. Over the weekend, northwesterlies will strengthen again over the country as another series of fronts move onto central and southern New Zealand. There is moderate confidence of warnable rainfall amounts over Fiordland, Westland and the Canterbury/Otago headwaters later Saturday and Sunday, and low confidence over Buller, Kahurangi National Park and the Tararua Range on Sunday.

Additionally, there is moderate confidence of another period of severe northwest gales about northern Marlborough, Wellington, Wairarapa, Tararua District and Central Hawke's Bay on Sunday and Monday morning. There is low confidence of severe northwest gales about other exposed parts of southern Marlborough, Canterbury, Otago, Southland and southern Fiordland later Saturday and into Sunday or early Monday, and also low confidence of severe gale west or southwest winds about southern Fiordland, Southland and Otago (mainly near the coast) later Sunday and early Monday.

Finally, there is low confidence that westerly winds could reach severe gale about other North Island areas from southern Northland to Hastings District and Kapiti, and also near Golden Bay, later Sunday and Monday.


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



	 Over the past two weeks the Commission's helpdesks (, ,) have received a significant number of calls relating to voting place (VP) staff trying to access their eLearning. It has been difficult to nail-down the actual issues being faced.
	 Due to initial understanding of the issues, VP staff were initially forwarded to the HQs for help. It became increasingly clear over the past week that HQ staff were only able to resolve the issue in a very limited number of cases, and that the issues being experienced were much wider than that.
	The phone number that VP staff access for eLearning help is now directed fully at the eLearning helpdesk, away from the HQs and CCL.
	 While it is clear that the large majority of VP staff are able to access their eLarning without incident, the eLearning team is now receiving significantly more calls than planned for – about a very wide variety of eLearning issues. The team received ~1,000 calls in total in 2020 but have already received 1,068 to date.
	The majority of issues appear to relate to the 'single-sign on' (SSO) process required for some voting place staff roles – VPMs, VAs and ISOs.
	Issues we can address:
	 Ensuring VP staff get to the right Tupu login site. There are two Tupu sites as a result of the SSO requirements. Those needing to complete SSO requirements go to one, while issuing officers are directed to another.
	 Helping staff finding it easier to login. The non-technical nature of our staff means that some are finding it difficult to complete the SSO process, which requires them to get through at least one MFA challenge.
	The above are exacerbated by staff having multiple VP roles. This is playing out in a number of issues (noted in category 3 below) – but some can be sorted by just helping VP staff step through the above.
	Ensuring the eLearning helpdesk has the resources it needs to cope with the amount of calls it is receiving, especially as this is (a) likely to continue and (b) in some cases may only be able to be

resolved manually (e.g. via Sarah in IT). Increasing recruitment staff's ability to understand their role and the impact of what they do in SnapHire on how EMS and AAD Issues that need more investigation – resolution unclear A reasonably common issue is known as the 'error writing to database' issue. 

Severe Weather Outlook

A ridge of high pressure moves onto northern New Zealand from the Tasman Sea on Tuesday bringing settled weather, then moves away to the east on Thursday. Meanwhile, a strong and moist northwest flow becomes established over southern New Zealand during Tuesday and early Wednesday, then a complex trough of low pressure crosses the South Island from the west on Friday.

There is high confidence rainfall amounts will reach warning criteria about Fiordland and Stewart Island late Wednesday and Thursday, and also about much of Westland and the Otago/Canterbury headwaters on Thursday and Friday. There is moderate confidence a heavy rain warning being required for the far north of Westland, Buller, far west Tasman, Nelson Lakes and also the Richmond and Bryant ranges on Friday. Lastly, there is low confidence of heavy rain for Southland and much of Otago on Thursday and Friday and about Mount Taranaki/Taranaki Maunga on Friday. Additionally, there is high confidence of severe northwest gales about Canterbury, Otago, Southland and southern Fiordland on Wednesday and Thursday. There is moderate confidence of severe northwest gales about Wairarapa, Wellington and Marlborough on Thursday and Friday.

A ridge of high pressure moves onto northern New Zealand from the Tasman Sea on Tuesday bringing settled weather, then moves away to the east on Thursday. 
Severe Weather Outlook

On Wednesday a moist northwesterly flow strengthens over the South Island bringing a high confidence in warning amounts of rain for Fiordland and the far south of Westland. There is also a high confidence in severe gale northwesterlies affecting Canterbury, Otago, Southland and Fiordland.

On Thursday and active front preceded by a strong northwesterly flow moves north onto the south of the South Island. There is then a **high confidence in warning amounts of rain for Fiordland,**Westland, and the headwaters of the Canterbury and Otago lakes and rivers. 
Severe Weather Outlook





Severe Weather Outlook




On Thursday an active front preceded by a strong northwesterly flow moves north over the lower South Island. There is then a high confidence in warning amounts of rain for Fiordland, Westland, and the headwaters of the Canterbury and Otago lakes and rivers. There is a moderate confidence in warning amounts of rain for Southland, Clutha and inland Otago. There is a high confidence in winds reaching severe gale force about the Southern Alps in Otago and Canterbury and a low confidence in severe gale force winds for the west of Marlborough and the Marlborough Sounds and also Wellington and the south of Wairarapa.

On Friday the front is expected to move north over the central and upper South Island. There is then a high confidence in warning amounts of rain for Westland and the headwaters of the Canterbury lakes and rivers. There is a low confidence in warning amounts of snow for the Canterbury high country. There is a low confidence in severe gale force winds affecting the west of Marlborough, the Marlborough Sounds and also Wellington and the south of Wairarapa. There is a low confidence in warning amounts of rain for Buller and the far west of Nelson.

On Saturday the front moves north over the upper South Island and onto the North Island. There is then a low confidence in warning amounts of rain for Nelson, the west of Marlborough and the Marlborough Sounds, the Tararua Range, Taranaki, the central North Island high country and the eastern ranges of the Bay of Plenty.

The front is expected to move away to the east on Sunday but there is still a low confidence that it could bring warning amounts of rain to the ranges of the eastern Bay of Plenty then.







It was noted the remediation of reprinting all Māori electorate ballot papers could significantly impact the field's ability to provide services to Māori voters, particularly as the logistics that ensure ballot papers are ready for voting on Monday are well underway (particularly for large, rural electorates). Removing and replacing ballot paper pads at this late stage would create an operational impact that would also risk impacting voters.

AGREED ACTIONS:

- The VS field will proceed with using the current printed Māori electorate ballot paper pads
- The VS Team will provide guidance to Electorate Managers on how to respond to this issue, should it be identified by a voter in a voting place

Ballot papers - Christchurch Central

- A number of ballot paper pads for Christchurch Central had perforation issues, which could create difficulties for vote issuing staff when issuing the papers.


Severe Weather Outlook







Incident Management Team (IMT) Update:

- IMT was stood up on 26 September.
- Generic communication on staff safety was sent out to EC All Staff yesterday, followed by a specific comms on disruptions in Wellington to the National Office staff this morning. There is no indication that the Commission is targeted.
- Some contingencies already planned by the Aitken Street Headquarters (HQs), including moving the trainings to the Rongotai HQ tomorrow.

- This issue is occurring only for the Māori electorates.
- Considered the impact of the issue and potential remediations:
 - Noted the remediation of reprinting all Māori electorate ballot papers could significantly impact the field's ability to provide services to Māori voters, particularly as the logistics that ensure ballot papers are ready for voting on Monday are well underway (particularly for large, rural electorates).
 - Removing and replacing ballot paper pads at this late stage would create an operational impact that would also risk impacting voters.

AGREED ACTIONS:

- The Voting Services (VS) field will proceed with using the current printed Māori electorate ballot paper pads
- The VS Team will provide guidance to Electorate Managers on how to respond to this issue, should it be identified by a voter in a voting place.

Ballot papers – Christchurch Central

Identified another issue in a number of ballot paper pads for Christchurch Central electorate -the
perforation of the ballot papers, which could create difficulties for vote issuing staff when issuing the
papers. Christchurch Central still has a sufficient number of pads to service voting places from Monday.



General Election 2023 Enrolment Campaign








Thunderstorm Outlook

The front continues heading north over the North Island this afternoon and evening.



	• iPhone and Instagram - We have had 2 reported instances via social media that the voter hasn't been able to download their voting papers due to the tooltip / pop up being over the link. They have been advised to use another browser and this has allowed them to download. We have spoken with IT and confirmed that there is not a full system bug (about 21,000 downloads so far) and this is likely due to human error but noting that Downloaded Voting Paper (DVP) was built back in 2005 while it has seen some upgrades to make it more mobile friendly, in some instance operating systems and browsers force unusual actions. Testing was done in IT using the browser stack software and one of the team had the same phone and it was checked on the device. Initial issue noted also that the team gave the wrong general response to the voter, this has now been addressed and the response reviewed and amended to ensure it captures these issues as well.
	 Chinese community – Strategic Engagement & Partnerships Team have noted that there is a WeChat conversation within the Chinese community encouraging domestic voters to vote using download and upload. IT have advised that there is the ability to check IP addresses for those who use the download service as the move through Cloudflare. However, we generally look at downloads on an individual basis if there is a need, as there is no simple way for us to view just overseas downloads as DVP sits within the MIKE environment. This makes it difficult to filter those on mass just for DVP vs all enrolment queries. However, the new upload system which also sits behind Cloudflare, can more easily check IP addresses specifically for overseas. This in addition to upload voting papers transactional logging provides us with more specific information on just "overseas voters". IT have checked and there have been a couple of New Zealand based IP addresses, which have been forwarded to the overseas to review. These are being looked for now and once we have the declarations, we will be able to do the individual download checks. We will advise more once we have found them. These may also be valid overseas voters as they can use a virtual private network which has a New Zealand ip addresses. So will need to check them against the Download Voting Papers information. - Since yesterday, the team had 688 tickets resolved, received 81 phone calls and made 20 outbound calls. 88% of tickets were resolved in one-touch. Telnet received 2,161 calls and 197 emails yesterday.
- The top enquiries were about EasyVote (18%), followed by Where to Vote questions (17%) and Update details (16%). 27% of the contacts were triggered by our website.

INSIGHTS (ANNEX):

Some analyses have been completed to understand the nature of call contacts received thus far, and a trend diagram is included in the Customers Enquiries section below. In summary,

- Since the end of August, there has been a significant increase in the percentage of "How do I vote?" contacts. This may be increased by people looking for information on EasyVote cards.
- While the enrolment related questions remain to be the main reason for contacting us, this was trending down since early September.
- New Zealanders have increasingly sought information on where they can vote since mid-September.
- Based on the forecast, it is expected each of these enquiries will continue to increase in proportion to other enquiries as the voting period continues.



Communications and Education




2023 Votes Estimates Summary Graph (Top 2 highest total votes)





Actual versus Estimates at Voting Places (more than 50% of the estimates)






Highest votes - North Shore









Severe Weather Outlook


Severe Weather Outlook



Ordinary Votes - Daily and cumulative




GE 2023 Voting

Forecast Rain 12-13 Oct






Ordinary Votes - Daily & Cumulative





Canterbury Severe Winds

Over the weekend strong winds impacted the Canterbury Region with red strong wind warnings in force throughout Saturday and were lifted Saturday evening. Impacts from the strong winds remain widely felt with power and communication outages continuing.


Yesterday Waimakariri District Council activated their Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) in response to prolonged power and communication outages. Last night there were approximately 10,000 connections throughout Canterbury without power. Christchurch and Selwyn are expected to have power back on this evening, and Waimakariri and Hurunui will know more later today.

The extended power outage is causing cellular and telecommunications to fail, hindering MainPower restoration. This morning 13 mobile sites are offline and approximately 30 mobile sites are running on gensets (generator and engine combination).

Power outages are affecting water pumping stations in Waimakariri and Hurunui Districts, and generators have been supplied to the 7 water pumping stations in Waimakariri District, with generators being mobilised for the 40 pumping stations impacted in Hurunui District.

The NEMA NCC continues to operate at Mode 1 – (MAR Centre Monitoring). The NEMA Duty REMA is actively engaging with Canterbury CDEM. Canterbury CDEM Group continues to monitor the situation.














Severe Weather Outlook








Severe Weather Outlook

Tomorrow, a front preceded by a strong moist north westerly flow moves east onto the south of the South Island. There is moderate confidence that rainfall amounts will reach warning criteria in Fiordland and a moderate confidence that severe northwesterly gales will affect the Canterbury high country, Otago, Southland and Fiordland. There is low confidence that rainfall over the North Island ranges south of Lake Taupo will reach warning amounts.

On Thursday, the front moves northeast over the South Island and onto the lower North Island. There is high confidence that rainfall accumulations will reach warning amounts in Fiordland, Westland, Buller and the headwaters of the Otago and Canterbury lakes and rivers. There is moderate confidence in severe northwest gales for the Canterbury high country and foothills, Marlborough, Wellington and Wairarapa south of Carterton. There is again low confidence that rainfall over the North Island ranges south of Lake Taupo will reach warning amounts.

A strong cold southwesterly flow is expected to affect the South Island on Friday.




Severe Thunderstorm Warnings

A front in the Tasman Sea moves onto the South Island during the second half of today. As the front moves northwards along the South Island west coast, there is a moderate risk of a few thunderstorms embedded within broader areas of rain about northern Fiordland this afternoon, and Westland, Buller and far western Tasman this evening and tonight. Any thunderstorms that occur in these areas will boost local rainfall rates.

There is also a moderate risk of a few thunderstorms about Southland and southern parts of Otago in the late afternoon and evening, and a moderate risk of one or two thunderstorms about North Otago, South Canterbury and Marlborough Sounds tonight. If any thunderstorms do occur in these areas, they will bring brief heavy rain and small hail.





Severe Weather Outlook



On Thursday, a front moves northeast over the South Island and onto the lower North Island, followed by a cold southwesterly flow. There is high confidence that rainfall accumulations will reach warning amounts in Fiordland, Westland, Buller and the headwaters of the Otago and Canterbury lakes and rivers. There is high confidence in severe northwest gales for exposed parts of the Canterbury high country and foothills, Marlborough, Wellington and Wairarapa south of Carterton. There is moderate confidence that rainfall over Mt Taranaki and the Tararua Range will reach warning amounts.


A strong cold southwesterly flow is expected to affect the South Island on Friday. Snow showers could lower to near sea level over parts of the South Island. There is low confidence in warnings amounts of snow for Clutha, Southland and the south of Fiordland. While warning amounts of snow are not expected farther north over the South Island, there is still a risk that roads will be affected by snow. The strong southwesterly winds, cold temperatures and snow to low levels is likely to affect the entire South Island, possibly bringing stress to livestock.

On Friday, there is moderate confidence that severe northwest gales will affect Wellington and Wairarapa including the Tararua District. A ridge of high pressure is expected to bring settled weather to New Zealand on Saturday.

Thunderstorm Outlook




An unstable westerly flow covers the central and southern North Island this morning as an upper cold trough moves across the area. There is a low risk of thunderstorms about ranges from the Kaimanawas to the northern Tararuas, southern Gisborne, Hawke's Bay and Tararua District this morning.

Later today, a front and associated rain-band in the Tasman Sea will move onto the southern South Island. There is a high risk of thunderstorms within the rainband about the mountains of northern and central Fiordland from this evening, and a moderate risk of thunderstorms spreading into southern Fiordland, far western Southland and Otago headwaters. There is a lower risk of thunderstorms about other parts of Southland, southern Westland and the southern Canterbury High Country from late evening.

These thunderstorms will boost local rainfall rates, mainly in the 15-25mm/h range, but there is a low risk of 25-35mm/h downpours associated with the thunderstorms about the Fiordland mountains. The thunderstorms will also be embedded within a strong

northwest flow, so gusts of 90-110km/h are possible, however as the storms are elevated, they are not expected to contribute any extra wind gusts.




TROPICAL CYCLONE FORECAST TRACK MAP




Severe Weather Outlook

Monday sees the beginning of the next rain band impacting the upper North Island, bringing moderate to low confidences of heavy rain and severe gales.




Thunderstorm Outlook

Tropical Cyclone Lola


Tropical Cyclone Lola (Cat 1) was located 200km west-northwest of Port Vila, Vanuatu at 0700hrs this morning (NZ time). The system is weakening rapidly and is expected to be reclassified as a tropical low in the next 6 hours. The system does not pose any direct threat to Vanuatu now. However, strong, or possible gale force winds and heavy rain affecting the southern parts of Vanuatu should ease during the day. The system is expected to move south and across New Caledonia tomorrow evening bringing strong winds and heavy rain.






Thunderstorm Outlook


Severe Weather Outlook

North Island Severe Weather

The weather system made up of remnants from Ex Tropical Cyclone Lola has caused moderate impacts, mainly throughout Northland and Waikato over the last 48 hours. The affected Groups monitored and dealt with impacts through business-as-usual arrangements, no activations were required. Approximately 2000 customers were without power in Northland yesterday morning after receiving strong winds overnight. This also led to the closure of some schools. These power outages have mostly been restored.

In Waikato, localised surface flooding in the Coromandel Peninsula led to the closures of some local roads and a couple of State Highway closures yesterday. SH 25 in Hikuai remains closed as flooding here did not subside overnight. Surface flooding driven by this morning's high tide may cause further local road closures. Residents in Coromandel Town, Matatoki, Puriri and Omahu are being asked to conserve water due to additional sediment. The NEMA MAR Centre continues to monitor as the weather system moves southeast.





There is also a moderate risk of thunderstorms for inland parts of the South Island from Inland Marlborough, Nelson, Buller, and the Canterbury High Country. Any thunderstorms that occur will bring localised heavy rain with rates of 10 to 25 mm per hour. For the South Island risk areas small hail is possible, and there is also a low risk of localised downpours (rainfall rates exceeding 25 mm per hour) from slow moving storms.




Severe Weather Outlook

North Island Severe Weather

As the weather has eased in the North Island, power has been restored to a majority of the upper North Island, however isolated power outages remain with very few impacted. Over the past 24 hours the weather system has moved southeast, causing minimal surface flooding and damage to lifelines. All roads impacted by this weather event have been re-opened.

Magnitude 6.6 Chile Earthquake

At 0134hrs this morning, a magnitude 6.6 earthquake occurred off the coast of central Chile at a depth of 20 km. The MAR Centre was notified through the Pacific Tsunami Warning Centre (PTWC) notifications. It was assessed as no threat to New Zealand as it was below threshold. No reports of damage or destruction have been observed.

Thunderstorms are expected to develop over central and southern North Island this afternoon, bringing heavy rain. This is reported on in the thunderstorm outlook below.



Severe Weather Outlook

A series of weak troughs and fronts are expected to move over Aotearoa during the outlook period. On Sunday, a high should develop over the South Island.

A front moving over the North Island late Thursday and during Friday could bring some heavy rain. There is low confidence that a heavy rainfall warning will be needed for the higher ground of Waitomo, Taranaki, and across to the Tongariro National Park.

Otherwise, afternoon warm air movement is expected in several inland areas during the outlook period and there may be localised heavy rain in some places, but widespread heavy rain is unlikely.



Thunderstorm Outlook


Scattered heavy showers and thunderstorms are expected about parts of the central and southern North Island today.

This afternoon, there is a high risk of thunderstorms from eastern Waikato, across inland Bay of Plenty, Rotorua to Gisborne, and south to inland Whanganui, Manawatu, Hawke's Bay, and Wairarapa. These thunderstorms will produce localised heavy rain of 10-25 mm/h, small hail, and even the risk of a small tornado. Additionally, there is a low risk that some of these thunderstorms could become severe and produce localised downpours of 25-40 mm/h.

However, about the central and eastern areas of the North Island, the risk of severe thunderstorms increases to moderate, and a severe thunderstorms watch is in force. There are lower risks of thunderstorms across most of the North Island and inland Marlborough and North Canterbury.







Current Weather

This afternoon, thunderstorms are expected to develop over the south of Otago, inland Dunedin, Clutha, Southland away from the coast, and the east of Fiordland.

From about 1500hrs today, there is a moderate risk that a few of these may be severe, bringing localised downpours with rainfall intensities of 25 to 40 mm/h. The storms should ease late this evening.







Thunderstorm Outlook

Fronts from the Tasman Sea move onto New Zealand today. Ahead of the fronts, showers are expected about inland areas of both islands.

For the North Island, the risk of thunderstorms is moderate for areas in the Hawke's Bay, the east of Taihape, and the east of Taupo. These thunderstorms are expected to bring heavy rain, with intensities of 15 to 25 mm/h, and hail. For the central North Island, there is a low risk of thunderstorms in the afternoon.

For the South Island, there is a moderate risk of thunderstorms during the afternoon for inland Southland, Fiordland, and the far south of Otago. These are expected to bring localised heavy rain, with intensities of 10 to 25 mm/h (possibly more for Southland), and small hail. There is a moderate risk of severe thunderstorms bringing downpours with hourly rainfall rates of 25 to 40 mm/h. A lower risk of thunderstorms covers much of the remaining inland South Island.

On Friday morning, a front move east onto the far north of the country, likely to be accompanied by bursts of heavy rain.


Severe Weather Outlook

A trough of low pressure is expected to move onto the South Island on Saturday.

From Sunday to Tuesday, the trough and an unsettled south to southeast flow affects central parts of Aotearoa, bringing rain or showers, especially to eastern areas.

At present there is uncertainty with which areas will see the most rain, and whether the rain will be heavy enough to require any rain warnings. However, for northern Canterbury and Marlborough on Monday, there is low confidence for significant amounts of heavy rain.




Thunderstorm Outlook


Severe Weather Outlook



North Island Severe Weather

The weather system made up of remnants from Ex Tropical Cyclone Lola has caused moderate impacts, mainly throughout Northland and Waikato over the last 48 hours. The affected Groups monitored and dealt with impacts through business-as-usual arrangements, no activations were required. Approximately 2000 customers were without power in Northland yesterday morning after receiving strong winds overnight. This also led to the closure of some schools. These power outages have mostly been restored.

In Waikato, localised surface flooding in the Coromandel Peninsula led to the closures of some local roads and a couple of State Highway closures yesterday. SH 25 in Hikuai remains closed as flooding here did not subside overnight. Surface flooding driven by this morning's high tide may cause further local road closures. Residents in Coromandel Town, Matatoki, Puriri and Omahu are being asked to conserve water due to additional sediment. The NEMA MAR Centre continues to monitor as the weather system moves southeast.





There is also a moderate risk of thunderstorms for inland parts of the South Island from Inland Marlborough, Nelson, Buller, and the Canterbury High Country. Any thunderstorms that occur will bring localised heavy rain with rates of 10 to 25 mm per hour. For the South Island risk areas small hail is possible, and there is also a low risk of localised downpours (rainfall rates exceeding 25 mm per hour) from slow moving storms.




Severe Weather Outlook







Thunderstorm Outlook

Fronts from the Tasman Sea move onto New Zealand today. Ahead of the fronts, showers are expected about inland areas of both islands.

For the North Island, the risk of thunderstorms is moderate for areas in the Hawke's Bay, the east of Taihape, and the east of Taupo. These thunderstorms are expected to bring heavy rain, with intensities of 15 to 25 mm/h, and hail. For the central North Island, there is a low risk of thunderstorms in the afternoon.

For the South Island, there is a moderate risk of thunderstorms during the afternoon for inland Southland, Fiordland, and the far south of Otago. These are expected to bring localised heavy rain, with intensities of 10 to 25 mm/h (possibly more for Southland), and small hail. There is a moderate risk of severe thunderstorms bringing downpours with hourly rainfall rates of 25 to 40 mm/h. A lower risk of thunderstorms covers much of the remaining inland South Island.

On Friday morning, a front move east onto the far north of the country, likely to be accompanied by bursts of heavy rain.


Severe Weather Outlook

A trough of low pressure is expected to move onto the South Island on Saturday.

From Sunday to Tuesday, the trough and an unsettled south to southeast flow affects central parts of Aotearoa, bringing rain or showers, especially to eastern areas.

At present there is uncertainty with which areas will see the most rain, and whether the rain will be heavy enough to require any rain warnings. However, for northern Canterbury and Marlborough on Monday, there is low confidence for significant amounts of heavy rain.

Over the past 24 hours the weather system has moved southeast, causing minimal surface flooding and damage to lifelines. All roads impacted by this weather event have been re-opened.

Magnitude 6.6 Chile Earthquake

At 0134hrs this morning, a magnitude 6.6 earthquake occurred off the coast of central Chile at a depth of 20 km. 





Additionally, there is a low risk that some of these thunderstorms could become severe and produce localised downpours of 25-40 mm/h.

However, about the central and eastern areas of the North Island, the risk of severe thunderstorms increases to moderate, and a severe thunderstorms watch is in force. There are lower risks of thunderstorms across most of the North Island and inland Marlborough and North Canterbury.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board:

- note that oversight arrangements for the General Election 2023 (GE2023) have been developed including a General Election Delivery Taskforce (GEDT)
- 2. provide feedback on the proposed oversight arrangements for GE2023 and the draft GEDT Terms of Reference

Purpose

1. This report seeks the Board's feedback on the proposed oversight arrangement structure for GE2023 delivery and the draft GEDT Terms of Reference (ToR).

Background

Purpose of General Election Delivery Taskforce

- 2. The purpose of the GEDT is to provide regular updates to the Executive Leadership Team (ELT) on the day-to-day delivery across the regions by Regional Managers (RMs) closer to the election date. GEDT will be a forum for decision makers to inform and raise issues and risks that may affect election delivery.
- 3. The secondary purpose of GEDT is to provide trust and confidence that the organisation is well prepared and ready to mitigate any real-time issues and risks whilst it is delivering the election on the ground. GEDT is a point of coordination and advice to support the RMs and ELT.

Oversight arrangement structure

- 4. The proposed structure consists of five groups/levels:
 - Electoral Commission Board
 - ELT
 - GEDT
 - Managers reporting to GEDT managing their teams and delivery
 - External partners through the NZ Strategic Crisis Management System (ODESC) and Risk and Security Working Group.

i. Electoral Commission Board

Key focus areas for the Board are:

- Assure overall delivery of GE2023
- Monitor overall delivery of GE2023 against statutory requirements

- Make decisions reserved to the Board
- Provide direction and/or decisions on the most significant risks and issues
- Brief Prime Minister, Ministers and leaders of parties as required
- Support and advise the Chief Electoral Officer/Chief Executive (CEO) on exercise of his delegations.

ii. Executive Leadership Team

Key focus areas for ELT are:

- Support and advise the Board and CEO on achieving their GE2023 accountabilities and any other matters as required
- Provide strategic leadership, management and/or advice on significant issues as determined by CEO or DCE, Operations
- Ensure operational delivery and resolution of significant issues are adequately resourced and supported.

iii. General Election Delivery Taskforce

Key focus areas for GEDT are:

- Oversight and management of operational delivery of GE2023 from writ day to return of writ
- Monitor, assure and allocate resources to support successful delivery
- Support decision-making delegated to DCE Operations, Directors, RMs, etc
- Escalate significant issues to CEO, ELT and/or Board
- Advise CEO, ELT and Board on delivery progress and resolution of issues
- Support and coordinate field delivery by RMs.

iv. Managers and field staff

- Each member of GEDT will have "Daily Stand-Ups" prior to attending GEDT meetings to provide 'live' input to GEDT on key relevant topics/events whilst delivering the election.
- An example of this is, the five RMs and Overseas Operations Manager receive updates from Electorate Managers on any issues/risks within each region. This is escalated and discussed at GEDT.

v. External partners

- The Commission has partnered with other agencies across government to support the Electoral Commission (EC) on any security and safety risk, major events, crisis and possible threat to GE2023.
- The NZ Strategic Crisis Management System (ODESC) is responsible for developing plans specific for the hazards and threats they manage, and for acting as the 'Lead Agency' responsible for coordinating the all-of-government planning and response to any disruptive event, with other agencies acting in 'support'.
- The CEO chairs Officials Committee which provides advice on planning (from an election perspective) for
 responses to disruptive events that may impact the GE. The Committee includes representation from
 Ministry of Justice, Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet (including National Emergency Management
 Agency), Government Communications Security Bureau, New Zealand Security Intelligence Service, Te Puni
 Kökiri, Ministry for Foreign Affairs and Trade, and New Zealand Police.
- EC has also established a Risk and Security Working Group to support the delivery of GE2023. This includes representatives from agencies on the Senior Officials Committee and staff from the Commission.
- 5. GEDT will comprise of three Directors of the Operations Group (Enrolment, Voting Services and Strategic Engagement and Partnerships), ICT, People & Culture, Comms & Education, Legal & Policy, Data Insights, Overseas Operations Manager, Security, Principal Advisor Voting Services and the five RMs. GEDT will provide regular updates to the ELT Stand-Up with actions and mitigations and escalate any risks/issues to the CEO or the ELT for decision.

- 6. GEDT is chaired by the DCE Operations. The Deputy Chair will be the Director of Voting Services.
- 7. The ELT Stand-Up consists of members of the ELT and will be chaired by the CEO.
- 8. The CEO will provide updates to the Electoral Commission Board as and when required.
- 9. The proposed oversight arrangement structure for GE2023 is included as **Appendix A** and a draft GEDT Terms of Reference is included (**Appendix B**) for the purpose of transparency and clarity of the function of the model.



Roles and responsibilities

10. The table below provides a summary of roles, membership and key purpose:

Discussion

How will GEDT work?

- 11. GEDT is a strategic advisory and decision-making forum and provides updates to the ELT Stand-Ups to assist the CEO and ELT in delivering the Commission's day-to-day operations of the General Election.
- 12. The proposed cadence for GEDT is:

Cadence for GEDT:	Notes:
ELT Stand Up – Led by CEO - 9am (15m)	GEDT commences at 1.00pm daily and receives current information and actions. ELT is kept
GEDT – Led by DCE Operations - 1pm (30m)	abreast with current information. The morning stand-up allows ELT to discuss actions/updates
ELT Stand Up – Led by CEO – 4.30pm (15m)	from the previous day and the afternoon stand- op is to check-in on the actions.
	The CEO provides updates to the Electoral Commission Board

- 13. The role of the GEDT Chairperson is to lead GEDT and facilitate the effective contribution of all members to update GEDT on events, reach robust decisions and ensure outcomes and actions are linked to a staff with timeframes. GEDT will be supported with a secretariat to provide administrative support.
- 14. The key role of the Chairperson is to work closely with the Programme Director and ELT on any significant issues that are raised at GEDT.
- 15. Each member and their respective team are expected to have their own stand-up meetings to identify and raise issues/incidents and oversee issue resolution. This will provide senior managers with the information they need to report into the Situation Report (SitRep).
- 16. A SitRep will be captured daily including decisions and action register. SitRep will include confirmation of any actions, due date, accountable member and the person responsible for implementation of the action item.
- 17. A SitRep with outcomes will be provided to ELT Stand-Up.
- 18. The suggested inputs that GEDT will be seeking are as follows:
 - Trends from dashboards
 - Risks
 - Staffing challenges across the regions
 - Health and safety
 - Media (including other channels e.g. social media trends, issues)
 - Call Centre stats
 - Supply chain issues/updates
 - Roading and transportation issues
 - Materials update
 - IT issues
 - Security and safety.
- 19. The above is not an exhaustive list as it is dependent on events and timeline of the election and some of the above items may no longer be relevant closer to the election date.

What happens when there is a security crisis or a major incident?

- 20. If there is major security crisis, critical risk, national event or crisis that requires all-government response (e.g. national security risk, cyber-attack, riot, terrorism, etc), this is managed by the NZ Strategic Crisis Management System (ODESC) which is run by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) with other relevant government agencies in supporting the delivery of the General Election.
- 21. Any risk or event that can/may contribute to a disruption of delivering the General Election, or affect the reputation of EC and trust in democracy, or critical information that is relevant to GE, e.g. loss of ballot boxes within an electorate, problems with voting place/s that can affect a site (security, roof leaks, entire staff safety etc), negative social media trend, constant negative behaviour of a certain group of people, break-in of a location, spread of Covid 19 within a team, major weather event, etc will be managed by GEDT.
- 22. ODESC provides the governance and response architecture to mitigate and manage hazards and threats which have the potential to disrupt the electoral process. Within the ODESC system, individual government agencies are responsible for developing plans specific for the hazards and threats they manage, and for acting as the 'Lead Agency' responsible for coordinating the all-of-government planning and response to any disruptive event created by that hazard or threat, with other agencies acting in 'support'.
- 23. ODESC system will support the EC as the parliamentary electoral events meets the threshold for central government and inter-agency support through the National Security System (NSS).
- 24. The ODESC System will be triggered when Lead Agencies escalate concerns about emerging national security risk/events for appropriate consideration and possible activation. If the threat could impact the GE2023 process, the Lead Agency will contact the EC to discuss that the situation warrants the activation of ODESC System.
- 25. The Senior Officials Committee (SOC) and Risk & Security Working Group provide support for the delivery of the GE2023 process. The chairs of these two bodies report into the National Security System governance system.
- 26. The SOC will provide advice on planning (from an election perspective) for responses to disruptive events that may impact the GE2023 process. The SOC also ensures the EC and government agencies are clear on their individual and shared responsibilities for the management of, and response to, disruptive events.
- 27. The Risk & Security Working Group keeps the SOC, wider ODESC system and other required agencies/entities informed of the risk profile and inter-agency preparedness for the election. Through the Working Group, the EC will work with other government agencies to understand current threshold, authorities, freedoms, limitations and constraints granted by legislation.

When will GEDT take place?

- 28. The CEO receives the writ from the Governor-General on Sunday, 10 September 2023. The suggested timeline to activate GEDT is from Sunday, 10 September to Saturday, 27 September. GEDT will meet three times a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday). If required, depending on current event, we can change this to a daily event.
- 29. Closer to the election, from Saturday, 27 September to Friday, 20 October, GEDT will meet daily.

Next steps


30. Once the oversight arrangement structure is finalised, the DCE Operations will socialise this with the relevant parties and set up and test the structure.

Appendix B: DRAFT Terms of Reference

General Election Delivery Taskforce (GEDT)

Purpose:

The overarching purpose of the General Election Delivery Taskforce is to assist and enable the Electoral Commission to fulfil its key areas of focus:

- Provide assurance to ELT and the Board on the status of election activities across the country
- Provide trust and confidence in the General Election
- Provide a point of escalation of issues and risks
- Provide support and solutions to field staff

Functions:

The GEDT is responsible for:

- Driving, coordinating, monitoring the conduct of the electoral event/s across the country, to ensure consistent election delivery;
- Managing key operational risks and ensuring the effectiveness of the controls;
- Driving coordinated and consistent progression of activities against the Writ to Writ timetable;
- Identifying, raising and discussion issues in a timely manner;
- Exemplifying leadership and best practise in the management of GE operations and delivery;
- Ensuring fit for purpose briefings on new and emerging issues impacting on election delivery;
- Ensuring awareness of media coordination and responses; and
- Ensuring where appropriate awareness of security issues.

Members

Members of the General Election Delivery Taskforce are as follows:

- Deputy Chief Executive Operations (Chairperson),
- Director Voting Services (Deputy Chairperson)
- Director Enrolment
- Director Strategic Engagement and Partnerships
- Chief Information Officer
- Manager People and Culture
- Manager Communications and Education

- Principal Advisor Legal
- Principal Advisor Data Insights
- Manager Finance and Administration
- Overseas Operations Manager
- Senior Advisor Security
- Principal Advisor Voting Services
- 5 Regional Managers
- Secretariat Principal Advisor Operations and Executive Assistant to DCE.

Member responsibilities are to provide updates on areas of responsibility as required and ensure the completion of relevant action items raised at meetings. Each member and their respective team are expected to have their own stand-up meetings to identify and raise issues/incidents and oversee issue resolution. This will provide members of GEDT with the information they need to report into SitRep.

Members are expected to attend all meetings and are required to send a representative if they are unable to attend.

A majority members of the GEDT forms the quorum of the meeting.

Role of the Chairperson:

The role of the Chairperson is to lead GEDT and facilitate the effective contribution of all members to update GEDT on events, reach robust decisions and ensure outcomes and actions are linked to a staff with timeframe.

The Chairperson's role includes the following:

- Hold responsibility for facilitating the effectiveness of the meeting and its outcomes
- Evaluate options, identify problems and provide the relevant resources to support the delivery of the election
- Monitor and mitigate any risks escalated to GEDT
- Assess any critical issues and escalate to CE and ELT
- Liaison between GEDT, ELT and the Programme Director
- Provide updates at ELT Stand-Up.

Post GEDT update, the Chairperson will attend the afternoon ELT Stand-Up to provide a summary update, lessons learnt, assessment of the day and urgent request/decision that has been highlighted in the Actions Register from ELT.

ELT Stand-Up will be provided with the daily SitRep and Actions Register. The focus for ELT for the Stand-Up is on (critical) risks and challenges that are beyond the scope and functions of GEDT.

The Chairperson of GEDT is the Deputy Chief Executive Operations. Deputy Chairperson is the Director of Voting Services.

GEDT will be supported with a secretariat to provide administrative support.

Administration:

Meeting Frequency:

Once the Chief Electoral Officer has received the Writ (10 September 2023), GEDT will be activated. GEDT will meet 3 times a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) until 27 September 2023.

Closer to the election date, from 27 September to 20 October, GEDT will be daily at 1pm daily, including weekend meetings.

Structure of Meetings:

Meetings are a mix of face-to-face and virtual platform.

Agenda:

The secretariat will provide an agenda to all members at an agreed time.

Situation Report (SitRep):

A decision/actions register will be created which will document all relevant items from the daily updates. SitRep will capture the following:

- Decision and action register
- Confirmation of any actions
- Due date
- Accountable GEDT member
- The person responsible to implement the action.

Purpose

 The purpose of this memo is to seek approval for the amended governance structure for the 2023 General Election delivery.

Background

Why:

- This paper provides an overview of governance arrangements across the Electoral Commission during the general Election, with specific focus on the establishment of the General Election Delivery Taskforce and its function.
- 3. The purpose of the General Election Delivery Taskforce (GEDT) is to provide regular updates to the Executive Leadership Team on the day-to-day delivery by regional managers across the regions closer to the election date. GEDT will be a forum for decision makers to inform and raise issues that may affect election delivery.
- 4. The secondary purpose of GEDT is to provide trust and confidence that the organisation is well prepared and ready to mitigate any real time risks and issues whilst it is delivering the election on the ground. GEDT is a point of coordination and advice to support the Regional Managers (RMs) and Executive Leadership Team (ELT).

What:

- 5. The proposed governance structure consists of five different groups/levels:
 - Electoral Commission Board
 - Executive Leadership Team



- General Election Delivery Taskforce,
- · Managers reporting to GEDT managing their teams and delivery
- External Partners through the NZ Strategic Crisis Management System or ODESC, Senior Officials Committee and Risk and Security Working Group

i. Electoral Commission Board

Key focus areas for the Board are:

- Assure overall delivery of GE
- Monitor overall delivery of GE against statutory requirements
- Make decisions reserved to Board
- · Provide direction and/or decisions on the most significant risks and issues
- Brief Prime Minister, Ministers and leaders of parties as required
- Support and advise CEO on exercise of reserved delegations.

ii. Executive Leadership Team

Key focus areas for ELT are:

- Support and advise Board and CEO on achieving their GE accountabilities and any other matters as required
- Provide strategic leadership, management and/or advice on significant issues as determined by CEO or DCE, Ops
- Ensure operational delivery, and resolution of significant issues are adequately resourced & supported.

iii. General Eelection Delivery Taskforce:

Key focus areas for **GEDT** are:

- Oversight and management of operational delivery of GE from writ day to return of writ
- Monitor, assure and allocate resources, to support successful delivery
- Support decision making delegated to DCE Ops, Directors, Relationship Managers (RMs) etc
- · Escalate significant issues to CEO, ELT and or Board
- Advise CEO, ELT and Board on delivery progress and resolution of issues
- Support and coordinate field delivery by RMs.

iv. Managers and field staff:

 Each member of GEDT will have "Daily Stand-Ups" prior to attending GEDT to provide 'live' input to GEDT on key relevant topics/events whilst delivering the election.



 An example of this is, the five Regional Managers and Overseas Operations Manager receive updates from Electorate Managers on any issues/risks within each region. This is escalated and discussed at GEDT.

v. External Partners

- The Commission has partnered with other agencies across government to support the Electoral Commission on any security and safety risk, major events, crisis and possible threat to the General Election 2023 event.
- NZ Strategic Crisis Management System (ODESC) is responsible for developing plans specific for the hazards and threats they manage, and for acting as the 'Lead Agency' responsible for coordinating the all-of-government planning and response to any disruptive event, with other agencies acting in 'support'.
- Chief Electoral Officer is represented and Chairperson of the Senior Officials Committee, to provide advice on planning (from an elections perspective for responses to disruptive events that may impact the General Election. This includes representation from Ministry of Justice, Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet (including National Emergency Management Agency), Government Communications Security Bureau, New Zealand Security Intelligence Service, Te Puni Kökiri, Ministry for Foreign Affairs and Trade and New Zealand Police.
- EC has also established a Risk and Security Working Group to support the delivery of the 2023 GE. This includes representatives from agencies from Senior Officials Committee and internal staff from the Commission.
- 6. GEDT membership will comprise representatives of three Directors of the Operations Group (Enrolment, Voting Services and Strategic Engagement and Partnerships), ICT, People & Culture, Comms & Education, Legal & Policy, Data Insights, Overseas Operations Manager, Security Advisor, Principal Advisor Voting Services, and five Regional Managers. GEDT will provide regular updates to the ELT Stand-Up with actions and mitigations and escalate any risk issues to the Chief Electoral Officer or the ELT for decision.
- 7. GEDT is chaired by the Deputy Chief Executive Operations. The Deputy Chair will be the Director of Voting Services.
- 8. ELT Stand Up consist of members of the Executive Leadership Team and led by the Programme Director.
- 9. The Chief Electoral Officer/Chief Executive will provide updates to the Electoral Commission Board as and when required.
- 10. The proposed oversight arrangements structure for GE23 is included as Appendix A and a draft Terms of Reference for GEDT is included (Appendix B) for the purpose of transparency and clarity of the function of the model.

How GEDT works?

- 12. GEDT is a strategic advisory and decision-making forum and provides updates to the ELT Stand-Ups to assist the Chief Executive and ELT in delivering the Commission's General Election.
- 13. The suggested cadence for GEDT:

ELT Stand Up - Led by Programme Director - 9am (15m)	GEDT starts in the middle of the day and receives current information and actions. ELT is kept abreast with current

- 14. The role of the Chairperson is to lead GEDT and facilitate the effective contribution of all members to update GEDT on events, reach robust decisions and ensure outcomes and actions are linked to a staff with timeframes. GEDT will be supported with a secretariat to provide administrative support.
- 15. Each member and their respective team are expected to have their own stand-up meetings to identify and raise issues/incidents and oversee issue resolution. This will provide senior managers with the information they need to report into the Situation Report (SitRep).
- 16. A Situation Report (SitRep) will be captured daily including decisions and action register. SitRep will include confirmation of any actions, due date, accountable member and the person responsible for implementation of the action item.
- 17. A SitRep with outcomes will be provided to ELT Stand-Up.
- 18. The suggested input that GEDT will be seeking for are as follows:
 - Trends from dashboards
 - Risks
 - Staffing challenges across the regions
 - Health and Safety
 - Media (including other channels e,g social media trends, issues,)
 - Call Centre stats
 - Supply Chain issues/updates
 - Roading and Transportation issues
 - Materials update
 - IT issues
 - Security.
- 19. The above is not a full exhaustive list as it is dependent on events and timeline of the election and some of the above items may no longer be relevant closer to the election date.



What happens when there is a security crisis or a major incident?

- 19. If there is major security crisis or event that requires all-government response (e.g national security risk, cyber-attack, etc), this is managed by the NZ Strategic Crisis Management System (ODESC) which is run by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) with other relevant government agencies in supporting the delivery of the General Election.
- 20. ODESC provides the governance and response architecture to mitigate and manage hazards and threats which have the potential to disrupt the electoral process. Within the ODESC system, individual government agencies are responsible for developing plans specific for the hazards and threats they manage, and for acting as the 'Lead Agency' responsible for coordinating the all-of-government planning and response to any disruptive event created by that hazard or threat, with other agencies acting in 'support'.
- 21. ODESC system will support the Electoral Commission as the parliamentary electoral events meets the threshold for central government and inter-agency support through the National Security System (NSS).
- 22. The ODESC System will be triggered when Lead Agencies escalate concerns about emerging national security risk/events for appropriate consideration and possible activation. If the threat could impact the 2023 GE process, the Lead Agency will contact the EC to discuss that the situation warrant the activation of ODESC System.
- 23. The Senior Officials Committee (SOC) and Risk & Security Working Group provide support for the delivery of the 2023 GE process. The Chairs of these two bodies report into the National Security System governance system.
- 24. The SOC will provide advice on planning (from an election perspective) for responses to disruptive events that may impact the GE23 process.
- 25. The SOC ensures the EC and government agencies are clear on their individual and shared responsibilities for the management of, and response to, disruptive events.
- 26. The Risk & Security Working Group keeps the Senior Officials Committee (SOC), wider ODESC system and other required agencies/entities informed of the risk profile and inter-agency preparedness for the election. Through the Working Group, the EC will work with other government agencies to understand current threshold, authorities, freedoms, limitations and constraints granted by legislation.

When to activate GEDT?

- 24. The Chief Electoral Officer receives the writ from the Governor-General on Sunday, 10 September 2023. The suggested timeline to activate GEDT is from Sunday, 10 September to Saturday, 27 September. GEDT will meet three times a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday). If required, depending on current event, we can change this to a daily event.
- 25. Closer to the election, from Saturday, 27 September to Friday, 20 October, GEDT will meet daily.

Discussion

26. We are seeking approval on the amended oversight arrangements for GE2023 and the establishment of the General Election Delivery Taskforce.



27. The DCE has consulted with individual key ELT members, Programme Director and key staff on the proposal and had received their feedback.

Timeframe



Purpose:

The overarching purpose of the General Election Delivery Taskforce is to assist and enable the Electoral Commission to fulfil its key areas of focus:

- Provide assurance to ELT and the Board on the status of election activities across the country
- Provide trust and confidence in the General Election
- · Provide a point of escalation of issues and risks
- Provide support and solutions to field staff

Functions:

The GEDT is responsible for:

- Driving, coordinating, monitoring the conduct of the electoral event/s across the country, to ensure consistent election delivery;
- Managing key operational risks and ensuring the effectiveness of the controls;
- Driving coordinated and consistent progression of activities against the Writ to Writ timetable;
- Identifying, raising and discussion issues in a timely manner;
- Exemplifying leadership and best practise in the management of GE operations and delivery;
- Ensuring fit for purpose briefings on new and emerging issues impacting on election delivery;
- · Ensuring awareness of media coordination and responses; and
- Ensuring where appropriate awareness of security issues.



Members

Members of the General Election Delivery Taskforce are as follows:

- Deputy Chief Executive Operations Group (Chairperson),
- Director Voting Services (Deputy Chairperson)
- Director Enrolment
- Director Strategic Engagement and Partnerships
- Chief Information Officer,
- P&C Manager.

- · Principal Advisor Data Insights,
- Manager Finance and Administration,
- Overseas Operations Manager,
- · Senior Advisor Security,
- Principal Advisor Voting Services,
- 5 Regional Managers
- Secretariat Principal Advisor Operations and Executive Assistant to DCE

Member responsibilities are to provide updates on areas of responsibility as required and ensuring the completion of relevant action items raised at meetings. Each member and their respective team are expected to have their own stand-up meetings to identify and raise issues/incidents and oversee issue resolution. This will provide members of GEDT with the information they need to report into SitRep.

Members are expected to attend all meetings and are required to send a representative if they are unable to attend.

Majority members of the GEDT form the quorum of the meeting.

Role of the Chairperson:

The role of the Chairperson is to lead GEDT and facilitate the effective contribution of all members to update GEDT on events, reach robust decisions and ensure outcomes and actions are linked to a staff with timeframe.

The Chairperson's role includes the following:

- Hold responsibility for facilitating the effectiveness of the meeting and its outcomes;
- Evaluate options, identify problems and provide the relevant resources to support the delivery of the election



- Monitor and mitigate any risks escalated to GEDT
- Assess any critical issues and escalate to CE, and ELT.
- Liaison between GEDT, ELT and the Programme Director.
- Update the Programme Director and ELT Stand Up on GEDT's response

Post GEDT update, the Chairperson will attend the afternoon ELT Stand Up to provide a summary update, lessons learnt, assessment of the day and urgent request/decision that has been highlighted in the Actions Register from ELT.

ELT Stand Up will be provided with the daily SitRep and Actions Register. The focus for ELT for the Stand Up are on (critical) risk and challenges that is beyond the scope and functions of GEDT.

The Chairperson of GEDT is the Deputy Chief Executive of the Operations Group. Deputy Chairperson is the Director of Voting Services.

GEDT will be supported with a secretariat to provide administrative support.

Administration:

Meeting Frequency:

Once the Chief Electoral Officer has received the Writ (10 September 2023), GEDT will be activated. GEDT will meet 3 times a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) until 27 September 2023.

Closer to the election date, from 27 September to 20 October, GEDT will be daily at 1pm daily, including weekend meetings.

Structure of Meetings:

Meetings are a mix of face-to-face and virtual platform.

Agenda:

The secretariat will provide an agenda to all members at an agreed time.

Situation Report (SitRep):

A decision/actions register will be created which will document all relevant items from the daily updates. SitRep will capture the following:

- Decision and action register
- Confirmation of any actions
- Due date
- Accountable GEDT member
- · The person responsible to implement the action.

The secretariat will provide the SitRep of the day and Actions Register for the afternoon ELT Stand Up. These documents will be saved in a folder that will be accessible to all members of GEDT.



Item: Clarity of roles and functions between the General Election Delivery Taskforce

(Taskforce) and Incident Management Team (IMT) in managing disruptive

incidents

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board:

- 1. **Note** the report entitled, "Clarity of roles and functions between the General Election Delivery Taskforce (Taskforce) and Incident Management Team (IMT) in managing disruptive incidents" for their information.
- Note the difference in the roles and functions between the General Election Delivery Taskforce (Taskforce)
 and Incident Management Team (IMT) to manage any disruptive incidents in accordance with the Incident
 Management Framework.

Purpose

1. The purpose of the paper is to inform the Board on roles and functions of the Taskforce and IMT across different categories of incidents specified by the Incident Management Framework.

Background

- 2. In preparation for the delivery of the 2023 General Election, the Commission has set up the Taskforce to provide oversight management for the delivery of the General Election.
- 3. The purpose of the Taskforce are as follows:
 - Monitor delivery progress, manage and support de-escalation of issues and risks within the TOR of the Taskforce;
 - Provide effective collaboration and coordination of responses across groups; and
 - Escalate specific matters to the relevant governance group (e.g ELT, CE) if they are outside the mandate of the Taskforce to manage.
- 4. The purpose of the Incident Management Team (IMT) is to provide a coordinated response when the Commission's critical functions have been compromised. These events are likely categorised as a Level 3 Major, or Level 4 Severe in the Incident Management Framework, although some events categorised as a Level 2 Moderate may also be escalated to the IMT. The IMT will be activated by the Chief Electoral Officer on advice.
- 5. There are different categories of events/incidents/issues identified in the Incident Management Framework and each structure provides a different level of response. This paper provides guidance to the Board on different roles and functions across different categories as described in the Incident Management Framework.

Discussion

- 6. Delivering any general election is a complex exercise and requires thorough planning and extensive governance structures to support the operational delivery, the tactical support and decision-making responsibilities.
- 7. The interdependencies of different oversight structures across the Commission are connected based on the type of events and issues. How these events impact the critical functions of the Commission will require a different oversight group to manage in line with the categories described in the Incident Management Framework.

General Election Delivery Taskforce (Taskforce)

- 8. The Taskforce has oversight and makes decisions to support field staff to deliver the 2023 General Election. The function of the Taskforce is to provide regular updates to the Executive Leadership Team (ELT) on a day-to-day basis and escalate/resolve any issues that may affect the election delivery.
- 9. The Taskforce oversees all operational support at a national level and escalates issues when required to ELT and/or Board to make a decision that is outside the Taskforce mandate.
- 10. The Taskforce only supports (and/or monitors) issues that are operational (BAU decisions), Level 1 Minor incidents that affects teams and Level 2: Moderate incidents that affects groups as per the Incident Management Framework (although there may be some incidents affecting groups that could be escalated to the IMT).
- 11. The Taskforce does not manage any Level 3: Major incidents that has a national impact or Level 4: Severe incidents that involved the ODESC system/All of Government, but it may be kept informed from time to time and will provide support if required.
- 12. When there is a Level 3 or Level 4 incident, the Taskforce focuses on areas that are not affected by the L3 or L4 incident and continues to deliver the election.

Incident Management Team (IMT)

- 13. The National Incident Management Plan (NIMP) clearly defines three levels of responses:
 - A local response: which is led by a site lead. The Incident Response Lead is responsible for operational decisions onsite. At this level, it might be an Electorate Manager, or the relevant staff members (team) depending on the incident. (Level 1)
 - ii. Functional response: where an incident causes disruption to one of the Commission's critical functions. The relevant Business Continuity Plan (BCP) will be activated and led by the plan owner (group), who is also responsible for requesting support from IMT if necessary. (Level 2)
 - iii. National response: The Chief Electoral Officer will activate the IMT if the situation requires. The IMT will manage the response to this incident. (Level 3)
- 14. The NIMP states that an IMT is activated by the following triggers:
 - An incident has or might have an impact on the safety and wellbeing of our people or members of the public
 at one or more of our locations, and a response is not manageable within available resources at a site level.
 In this scenario the IMT may activate either to monitor and support the local response, or to manage the
 response from a national level. This will depend on the scale of the incident.
 - An incident has or might disrupt our ability to carry out one or more of our critical functions, for an intolerable length of time, or a response is not manageable within available resource at an operational level.
 - An incident has or might cause significant financial and/or reputational harm to our organisation.
 - An incident has or might have a national impact on the safety and wellbeing of our staff or members of the public.

- An incident has or may result in an increase in requests for support, advice and/or information from the Electoral Commission at a level beyond which our teams are able to manage within their usual resources. These requests may come from lead and/or support agencies, Ministers/Government and/or media.
- 15. The Incident Management Framework prescribes the following supporting plans to support field staff and the organisation across different levels of incidents:
 - Operations Manual, Incident Management Handbook and Personal Incident Manual
 - VP Incident Response Procedure
 - HQ Emergency Procedures
 - Unit Business Continuity Plan and Group Business Continuity Plan
 - Incident Communications Toolkit
 - National Incident Management Plan
 - GE2023 Business Continuity Plan
 - Adjournment Guidelines
 - Pandemic Plan

Scenarios across different incident categories, roles and functions

- 16. The table below provides different scenarios across different levels of incident as described in the Incident Management Framework to provide a high-level understanding between roles, functions and who makes the final decision to manage and/or de-escalate issues.
- 17. The table does not cover all types of incidents but provides examples of the escalation points, who specifically manages the issues and where issues are escalated to if they require a response.

(Taskforce) and Incident Management Team (IMT) in managing disruptive

incidents

Recommendations

It is recommended that the ELT:

- Note the difference in the roles and functions between the General Election Delivery Taskforce (Taskforce)
 and Incident Management Team (IMT) to manage any disruptive incidents in accordance with the Incident
 Management Framework.
- 2. **Approve** the report for the Board's agenda.

Purpose

1. The purpose of the paper is to inform the Executive Leadership Team on roles and functions of the Taskforce and IMT across different categories of incidents specified by the Incident Management Framework.

Background

- 2. In preparation for the delivery of the 2023 General Election, the Commission has set up the Taskforce to provide oversight management for the delivery of the General Election.
- 3. The purpose of the Taskforce are as follows:
 - Monitor delivery progress, manage and support de-escalation of issues and risks within the TOR of the Taskforce;
 - Provide effective collaboration and coordination of responses across groups; and
 - Escalate specific matters to the relevant governance group (e.g ELT, CE) if they are outside the mandate of the Taskforce to manage.
- 4. The purpose of the Incident Management Team (IMT) is to provide a coordinated response when the Commission's critical functions have been compromised. These events are likely categorised as a Level 3 Major, or Level 4 Severe in the Incident Management Framework, although some events categorised as a Level 2 Moderate may also be escalated to the IMT. The IMT will be activated by the Chief Electoral Officer on advice.
- 5. There are different categories of events/incidents/issues identified in the Incident Management Framework and each structure provides a different level of response. This paper provides guidance to the Board on different roles and functions across different categories as described in the Incident Management Framework.

Discussion

- 6. Delivering any general election is a complex exercise and requires thorough planning and extensive governance structures to support the operational delivery, the tactical support and decision-making responsibilities.
- 7. The interdependencies of different oversight structures across the Commission are connected based on the type of events and issues. How these events impact the critical functions of the Commission will require a different oversight group to manage in line with the categories described in the Incident Management Framework.

General Election Delivery Taskforce (Taskforce)

- 8. The Taskforce has oversight and makes decisions to support field staff to deliver the 2023 General Election. The function of the Taskforce is to provide regular updates to the Executive Leadership Team (ELT) on a day-to-day basis and escalate/resolve any issues that may affect the election delivery.
- 9. The Taskforce oversees all operational support at a national level and escalates issues when required to ELT and/or Board to make a decision that is outside the Taskforce mandate.
- 10. The Taskforce only supports (and/or monitors) issues that are operational (BAU decisions), Level 1 Minor incidents that affects teams and Level 2: Moderate incidents that affects groups as per the Incident Management Framework (although there may be some incidents affecting groups that could be escalated to the IMT).
- 11. The Taskforce does not manage any Level 3: Major incidents that has a national impact or Level 4: Severe incidents that involved the ODESC system/All of Government, but it may be kept informed from time to time and will provide support if required.
- 12. When there is a Level 3 or Level 4 incident, the Taskforce focuses on areas that are not affected by the L3 or L4 incident and continues to deliver the election.

Incident Management Team (IMT)

- 13. The National Incident Management Plan (NIMP) clearly defines three levels of responses:
 - A local response: which is led by a site lead. The Incident Response Lead is responsible for operational decisions onsite. At this level, it might be an Electorate Manager, or the relevant staff members (team) depending on the incident. (Level 1)
 - ii. Functional response: where an incident causes disruption to one of the Commission's critical functions. The relevant Business Continuity Plan (BCP) will be activated and led by the plan owner (group), who is also responsible for requesting support from IMT if necessary. (Level 2)
 - iii. National response: The Chief Electoral Officer will activate the IMT if the situation requires. The IMT will manage the response to this incident. (Level 3)
- 14. The NIMP states that an IMT is activated by the following triggers:
 - An incident has or might have an impact on the safety and wellbeing of our people or members of the public
 at one or more of our locations, and a response is not manageable within available resources at a site level.
 In this scenario the IMT may activate either to monitor and support the local response, or to manage the
 response from a national level. This will depend on the scale of the incident.
 - An incident has or might disrupt our ability to carry out one or more of our critical functions, for an intolerable length of time, or a response is not manageable within available resource at an operational level.
 - An incident has or might cause significant financial and/or reputational harm to our organisation.
 - An incident has or might have a national impact on the safety and wellbeing of our staff or members of the public.

- An incident has or may result in an increase in requests for support, advice and/or information from the Electoral Commission at a level beyond which our teams are able to manage within their usual resources. These requests may come from lead and/or support agencies, Ministers/Government and/or media.
- 15. The Incident Management Framework prescribes the following supporting plans to support field staff and the organisation across different levels of incidents:
 - Operations Manual, Incident Management Handbook and Personal Incident Manual
 - VP Incident Response Procedure
 - HQ Emergency Procedures
 - Unit Business Continuity Plan and Group Business Continuity Plan
 - Incident Communications Toolkit
 - National Incident Management Plan
 - GE2023 Business Continuity Plan
 - Adjournment Guidelines
 - Pandemic Plan

Scenarios across different incident categories, roles and functions

- 16. The table below provides different scenarios across different levels of incident as described in the Incident Management Framework to provide a high-level understanding between roles, functions and who makes the final decision to manage and/or de-escalate issues.
- 17. The table does not cover all types of incidents but provides examples of the escalation points, who specifically manages the issues and where issues are escalated to if they require a response.

Appendix B: DRAFT Terms of Reference

General Election Delivery Taskforce (GEDT)

Purpose:

The overarching purpose of the General Election Delivery Taskforce is to assist and enable the Electoral Commission to fulfil its key areas of focus:

- Provide assurance to ELT and the Board on the status of election activities across the country
- Provide trust and confidence in the General Election
- Provide a point of escalation of issues and risks
- Provide support and solutions to field staff

Functions:

The GEDT is responsible for:

- Driving, coordinating, monitoring the conduct of the electoral event/s across the country, to ensure consistent election delivery;
- Managing key operational risks and ensuring the effectiveness of the controls;
- Driving coordinated and consistent progression of activities against the Writ to Writ timetable;
- Identifying, raising and discussion issues in a timely manner;
- Exemplifying leadership and best practise in the management of GE operations and delivery;
- Ensuring fit for purpose briefings on new and emerging issues impacting on election delivery;
- Ensuring awareness of media coordination and responses; and
- Ensuring where appropriate awareness of security issues.

Members

Members of the General Election Delivery Taskforce are as follows:

- Deputy Chief Executive Operations (Chairperson),
- Director Voting Services (Deputy Chairperson)
- Director Enrolment
- Director Strategic Engagement and Partnerships
- Chief Information Officer
- Manager People and Culture
- Manager Communications and Education
- Manager Business Enablement
- Principal Advisor Legal

- Principal Advisor Data Insights
- Manager Finance and Administration
- Overseas Operations Manager
- Senior Advisor Security
- Principal Advisor Voting Services
- 5 Regional Managers
- Secretariat Principal Advisor Operations and Executive Assistant to DCE.

Member responsibilities are to provide updates on areas of responsibility as required and ensure the completion of relevant action items raised at meetings. Each member and their respective team are expected to have their own stand-up meetings to identify and raise issues/incidents and oversee issue resolution. This will provide members of GEDT with the information they need to report into SitRep.

Members are expected to attend all meetings and are required to send a representative if they are unable to attend.

A majority members of the GEDT forms the quorum of the meeting.

Role of the Chairperson:

The role of the Chairperson is to lead GEDT and facilitate the effective contribution of all members to update GEDT on events, reach robust decisions and ensure outcomes and actions are linked to a staff with timeframe.

The Chairperson's role includes the following:

- Hold responsibility for facilitating the effectiveness of the meeting and its outcomes
- Evaluate options, identify problems and provide the relevant resources to support the delivery of the election
- Monitor and mitigate any risks escalated to GEDT
- Assess any critical issues and escalate to CE and ELT
- Liaison between GEDT, ELT and the Programme Director
- Provide updates at ELT Stand-Up.

Post GEDT update, the Chairperson will attend the afternoon ELT Stand-Up to provide a summary update, lessons learnt, assessment of the day and urgent request/decision that has been highlighted in the Actions Register from ELT.

ELT Stand-Up will be provided with the daily SitRep and Actions Register. The focus for ELT for the Stand-Up is on (critical) risks and challenges that are beyond the scope and functions of GEDT.

The Chairperson of GEDT is the Deputy Chief Executive Operations. Deputy Chairperson is the Director of Voting Services.

GEDT will be supported with a secretariat to provide administrative support.

Administration:

Meeting Frequency:

Once the Chief Electoral Officer has received the Writ (10 September 2023), GEDT will be activated. GEDT will meet daily from 10 September until 20 October at 1pm, including weekend meetings.

Structure of Meetings:

Meetings are a mix of face-to-face and virtual platform.

Agenda:

The secretariat will provide an agenda to all members at an agreed time.

Situation Report (SitRep):

A decision/actions register will be created which will document all relevant items from the daily updates. SitRep will capture the following:

- Decision and action register
- Confirmation of any actions
- Due date
- Accountable GEDT member
- The person responsible to implement the action.

The secretariat will provide the SitRep of the day and Actions Register for the afternoon ELT Stand-Up. These documents will be saved in a folder that will be accessible to all members of GEDT.
