An election advertisement must include a promoter statement with the promoter's name and street address in accordance with section 204F of the Electoral Act. The billboards contain promoter statements that meet the requirements of the Act.

Section 204H of the Act requires a third party promoter to have obtained the prior written authorisation of the party secretary to publish an advertisement that may reasonably be regarded as encouraging or persuading voters to vote for a party. Based on the overall content and context of the billboards our view is that they may reasonably be regarded as encouraging or persuading voters not to vote for the Green Party. Accordingly, prior written

authorisation from you as the party secretary is not required.
