NEW ELECTORATE BOUNDARIES FINALISED

New boundaries for the country's 63 general and seven Māori electorates have been finalised – with a completely new electorate named Botany created in Auckland.

The 2007 Representation Commission has completed its statutory role of reviewing and redrawing electorate boundaries to be used in the next two general elections.

"We received 331 objections and 114 counter objections to the proposed electorate boundaries released in early May," says Judge Bernard Kendall, Chair of the Representation Commission. "This feedback and submissions made at hearings in seven centres around the country have helped shape the final boundaries to be used in the general elections scheduled for 2008 and 2011."

- Seven electorates have had no change to their boundaries.
- Nine electorates have new names.
- Macrons have been applied to 11 electorate names to assist with correct Māori pronunciation.

No Boundary Changes in Seven Electorates

Five general electorates - Whangarei, North Shore, Northcote, Tauranga, Kaikōura and two Māori electorates - Te Tai Tokerau and Waiariki retain the same boundaries used in the 2002 and 2005 general elections.

One Additional Electorate

An additional general electorate named Botany is being created in the south of Auckland. The Botany electorate comprises much of the Botany Community Board areas including the proposed new town centre of Flat Bush. It replaces parts of the former Clevedon and Manukau East electorates and includes the Cockle Bay area from the Pakuranga electorate.

New Names for Another Nine Electorates

The existing electorates of Clevedon, Port Waikato, Piako, Ohariu-Belmont, Banks Peninsula, Rakaia, Otago, Aoraki and Tainui are being replaced with new electorates with new names.

- Papakura replaces parts of the Clevedon, Port Waikato and Manurewa electorates.
 The Papakura electorate is centred on the Papakura urban area and includes
 Kingseat and Clarks Beach to the west. To the north it includes the suburbs of
 Wattle Downs, Mahia Park, and the suburbs of Manurewa East and The Gardens to the east of the motorway.
- **2. Hunua** replaces parts of the Clevedon and the existing Port Waikato electorates including the towns of Clevedon, Maraetai, Tuakau, Pukekohe, Waiuku and up to Manukau Heads.

- **3. Waikato** replaces parts of the Piako, Coromandel, Hamilton West and Taranaki King Country electorates. The Piako electorate disappears.
- **4. Ōhariu** replaces Ohariu-Belmont with the Belmont area shifted into the Rimutaka electorate.
- 5. Selwyn replaces parts of the Waimakariri, Banks Peninsula and Rakaia electorates.
- **6. Port Hills** is the new name for the revised Banks Peninsula electorate with most of the peninsula area itself transferred to Selwyn.
- 7. Rangitata replaces parts of the Aoraki and Rakaia electorates. It includes Timaru City, Temuka, Orari and Ashburton up to the Rakaia River. Pleasant Point and its immediate surrounds are included in this electorate. The Rakaia electorate disappears.
- 8. Waitaki replaces parts of the Otago and Aoraki electorates. The Waitaki electorate includes all of the Waitaki, Central Otago and Mackenzie Districts as well as the northern portion of Queenstown Lakes District around Wanaka and a portion of the Timaru District (excluding Timaru City) around Paeroa and Geraldine. The Aoraki and Otago electorates disappear.
- 9. Hauraki-Waikato replaces the Tainui electorate and includes population from the Tāmaki Makaurau electorate from the southern part of Manurewa. The people from Ngati Maniapoto (formerly in the Tainui electorate) will be in the Te Tai Hauāuru electorate with the people of Ngati Raukawa.

"Following the objection and counter-objection process a number of proposed Auckland electorate boundaries have been significantly redrawn. The new electorate created in Auckland is called Botany – not Howick as proposed," says Judge Kendall.

"There was objection to splitting the Timaru District Council between the two electorates of Waitaki and Rangitata. The Timaru District was not able to be placed in one electorate, however the Pleasant Point area has been kept with Timaru City in the Rangitata electorate to retain its principal community of interest.

"In the East Coast electorate, there was objection to including parts of the Gisborne District Council in the Napier electorate. The Cook Ward of the council has been retained in the East Coast electorate," says Judge Kendall.

"In the West Coast Tasman electorate there was objection to including Wakefield in this electorate. Wakefield could not be included in the Nelson electorate, however Brightwater will remain in the Nelson electorate.

"The Commission was able to meet the majority of objections focused on the electorates around Christchurch, with the result that the electorates there become primarily urban," says Judge Kendall.

The Representation Commission is due to reconvene again in 2012 (after the next scheduled population Census and Māori Electoral Option) to review and redraw electorate boundaries.

Kei te whakatūria he rohe pōti whānui tāpiri ki te tonga o Tāmaki-makau-rau, ko Botany te ingoa. Ko te rohe pōti o Botany te nuinga o ngā takiwā Poari Hapori o Botany tae atu ki te tāone hukihuki hōu o Flat Bush. Ka whakakapia e te rohe pōti tāpiri nei ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Clevedon me Manukau East i mua, ā, kei roto hoki te takiwā Cockle Bay nō te rohe pōti o Pakuranga.

Ngā Ingoa Hōu mō ngā Rohe Pōti e Iwa i Tua Atu

Ka whakakapia e ngā rohe pōti hōu me ngā ingoa hōu, ngā rohe pōti e tū nei o Clevedon, Port Waikato, Piako, Ohariu-Belmont, Banks Peninsula, Rakaia, Otago, Aoraki me Tainui.

1. Ko Papakura – ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Clevedon, Port Waikato me Manurewa. Kei waenganui i te rohe pōti o Papakura, ko te takiwā tāone o Papakura, ko Kingseat me Clarks Beach hoki ki te uru. Ā, ki te raki, ko ngā tapa tāone hoki o Wattle Downs me Māhia Park, ā, ngā tapa tāone anō hoki o Manurewa East me The Gardens i te taha rāwhiti o te ara nui.

- 2. Ko Hunua ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Clevedon me ērā o te rohe pōti o Port Waikato e tū nei tae atu ki ngā tāone o Clevedon, Maraetai, Tuakau, Pukekohe, Waiuku, ā, piki atu hoki ki Manukau Heads.
- 3. Ko **Waikato** ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Piako, Coromandel, Hamilton West me Taranaki King Country. Ka ngaro atu te rohe pōti o Piako.
- **4.** Ko **Ōhariu** ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu a Ohariu-Belmont me te neke i te takiwā o Belmont ki te rohe pōti o Rimutaka.
- **5.** Ko **Selwyn** ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Waimakariri, Banks Peninsula me Rakaia.
- **6.** Ko **Port Hills** te ingoa hōu mō te rohe pōti o Banks Peninsula kua whakahōungia me te whakawhiti i te nuinga o te koi ake ki Selwyn.
- 7. Ko Rangitata ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Aoraki me Rakaia. Ka uru atu hoki te Tāone Nui o Timaru me ngā tāone o Temuka, Ōrari me Ashburton hoki piki atu ki te Awa o Rakaia. Kua whakaurua hoki a Pleasant Point me ōna karapotinga tata ki te rohe pōti nei. Ka ngaro atu te rohe pōti o Rakaia.
- 8. Ko Waitaki— ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu ngā wāhanga rohe pōti o Otago me Aoraki. Kei roto hoki i te rohe pōti o Waitaki te katoa o ngā Taiwhenua o Central Otago me Mackenzie tae atu ki te wāhi whakateraki o te Taiwhenua o Queenstown Lakes huri noa ki Wānaka me tētahi wāhi Taiwhenua o Timaru (kāore koa ko te Tāone Nui o Timaru) huri noa hoki ki Paeroa me Geraldine. Ka ngaro atu ngā rohe pōti o Aoraki me Otago.
- 9. Ko Hauraki-Waikato ka whakakapia e tēnei rohe pōti hōu te rohe pōti o Tainui me te whakauru hoki i te taupori nō te rohe pōti o Tāmaki Makaurau mai i te wāhanga whakatetonga o Manurewa, ā, ka whakanohoa te iwi Ngāti Maniapoto (nō te rōhe pōti rātou i mua o Tainui) ki te rohe pōti o Te Tai Hauāuru i te taha o te iwi Ngāti Raukawa.

Ki tā Kaiwhakawā Kendall, "Whai muri i te hātepe whakahē, whakahē-ātete hoki, kua tino whakairoirotia anōtia ētahi taupā rohe pōti hukihuki i Tāmaki-makau-rau. Kua tapaina te rohe pōti i whakatūria ki Tāmaki-makau-rau, ko Botany – kāore ko Howick te ingoa hukihuki".

Ki tāna anō, "I puta he whakahē i te wehewehenga o te Kaunihera Taiwhenua o Timaru ki waenganui i ngā rohe pōti e rua o Waitaki me Rangitata. Kāore te Taiwhenua o Timaru i taea te whakanoho ki te rohe pōti kotahi, heoi, kua puria te takiwā o Pleasant Point ki te taha o te Tāone Nui o Timaru i te rohe pōti o Rangitata kia mau tonu ai tōna pānga hapori matua."

Ki tā Kaiwhakawā Kendall anō, "I puta he whakahē i te rohe pōti o East Coast mō te whakaurunga o ētahi wāhanga Kaunihera Taiwhenua o Gisborne ki te rohe pōti o Napier. Kua puria te Riu o Cook ki te rohe pōti o East Coast."

I kī anō hoki ia, "I puta he whakahē i te rohe pōti o West Coast Tasman mō te whakaurunga o Wakefield ki tēnei rohe pōti. Kāore a Wakefield i taea te whakauru atu ki te rohe pōti o Nelson, hēoi, e mau tonu ana a Brightwater ki te rohe pōti o Nelson".

Ko tā Kaiwhakawā Kendall anō hoki, "I taea e te Kōmihana te whakatutuki te nuinga o ngā whakahē i hāngai te arotahi ki ngā rohe pōti huri noa i Ōtautahi me te aha hoki, he matua rohe tāone aua rohe pōti i reira i nāianei."

Ā te tau 2012 Te Kōmihana Whakatau Rohe Pōti e hui ai anō (whai muri atu i te Tataunga tapori me te Kōwhiringa Pōti Māori kua whakaritea) ki te arotake me te whakairoiro taupā rohe pōti anō.

Final Electorate Boundaries for 2008 and 2011 Scheduled General Elections - Summary of Major Features

One New Additional Electorate

An additional electorate is being created in the south of Auckland named **Botany**. The Botany electorate comprises much of the Botany Community Board areas including the proposed new town centre of Flat Bush. It replaces parts of the former Clevedon and Manukau East electorates and includes the Cockle Bay area from the Pakuranga electorate.

Nine Electorates with New Names

The electorates below replace the existing electorates of Clevedon, Port Waikato, Piako, Ohariu-Belmont, Banks Peninsula, Rakaia, Otago, Aoraki and Tainui.

- Papakura replaces parts of the Clevedon, Port Waikato and Manurewa electorates.
 The Papakura electorate is centred on the Papakura urban area and includes
 Kingseat and Clarks Beach to the west. To the north it includes the suburbs of
 Wattle Downs, Mahia Park, and the suburbs of Manurewa East and The Gardens to
 the east of the motorway.
- Hunua replaces parts of the Clevedon and the existing Port Waikato electorates including the towns of Clevedon, Maraetai, Tuakau, Pukekohe, Waiuku and up to Manukau Heads.
- **Waikato** replaces parts of the Piako, Coromandel, Hamilton West and Taranaki King Country electorates. The Piako electorate disappears.
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 includes all of the Waitaki, Central Otago and Mackenzie Districts as well as the
 northern portion of Queenstown Lakes District around Wanaka and a portion of the
 Timaru District (excluding Timaru City) around Paeroa and Geraldine. The Aoraki and
 Otago electorates disappear.
- Hauraki-Waikato replaces the Tainui electorate and includes population from the Tāmaki Makaurau electorate from the southern part of Manurewa. The people from Ngati Maniapoto (formerly in the Tainui electorate) will be in the Te Tai Hauāuru electorate with the people of Ngati Raukawa.

Other Changes

North Island Electorates

- Northland extends south to include Wellsford.
- East Coast Bays loses Bayview and Witherford Heights to Helensville.
- Rodney loses the Wellsford area to Northland.
- **Helensville** receives Bayview and Witherford Heights and loses areas of Massey and an area south of Muriwai to the Waitakere electorate.
- Mt Albert receives Pt Chevalier from Auckland Central.
- **Pakuranga** stays very similar to the 2005 boundary (excluding Cockle Bay which is now in the new electorate of Botany).
- Manukau East now includes Otahuhu and Otara.
- Manurewa loses Manurewa East and Wattle Downs to Papakura.
- Maungakiekie now includes Royal Oak, Onehunga, Panmure and Point England.
- Coromandel now includes Te Aroha.
- Taupō shifts north to include Cambridge.
- Bay of Plenty includes the Kaimai Ward and loses the Maketu Ward.
- **Rotorua** shifts north to the Bay of Plenty coast and includes the Maketu Ward of the Western Bay of Plenty District.
- **Taranaki-King Country** now includes Raglan and Ohaupo. In the south it loses Opunake to Whanganui and Egmont Village to New Plymouth.
- The Napier electorate shifts north to include all of the Wairoa District.
- **East Coast** moves west to include the Bay of Plenty Plains up to the boundary between the Whakatane and Western Bay of Plenty Districts. It retains the Cook Ward of the Gisborne District.
- Rangitīkei now includes Ohakune and Taumaranui.
- **Palmerston North** is now a wholly urban electorate. It loses parts of the rural fringe to the Rangitīkei electorate.
- The **Whanganui** electorate now includes the Wanganui and South Taranaki Districts.
- Wairarapa extends north to include Waipawa and Waipukurau.

South Island Electorates

- **West Coast-Tasman** includes the northern area of Wakefield, up to but not including Brightwater.
- Invercargill expands west to include Riverton, north to include Hedgehope and Glencoe and east to the Southland District boundary.
- Clutha Southland expands to include Queenstown and Arrowtown.
- **Dunedin South** includes Middlemarch up to the Dunedin City boundary.
- **Dunedin North** includes Waikouaiti up to the Dunedin City boundary.
- **Wigram** loses Sydenham and Beckenham to Port Hills and gains Addington and HoonHay.
- Waimakariri loses parts of Papanui to the Christchurch Central electorate, and Bishopdale to the Ilam electorate and retains its community of interest around Oxford and Rangiora.

Māori Electorates

Adjustments have been made to the boundaries of five Māori electorates.

- **Te Tai Hauāuru** the changes will see the people from Ngati Maniapoto from Tainui included in Te Tai Hauāuru with the people of Ngati Raukawa.
- **Te Tai Tonga** moves southwards to a line running generally east to west through the Hutt Valley south of Naenae.
- **Ikaroa-Rāwhiti** extends to the western hills of the Hutt Valley to include Belmont, Taita and Naenae.
- Hauraki- Waikato replaces the Tainui electorate and includes population from the Tāmaki Makaurau electorate from the southern part of Manurewa. The people from Ngati Maniapoto (formerly in the Tainui electorate) will be in the Te Tai Hauāuru electorate with the people of Ngati Raukawa.
- Tāmaki Makaurau population from the southern part of Manurewa shifts to the new electorate of Hauraki-Waikato.

2007 Representation Commission Process

- 331 Objections, including 57 objections to proposed names were received. Including:
 - 584 petitioners in relation to the Manurewa electorate
 - 538 petitioners relating to the proposed West Coast-Tasman electorate
 - 191 petitioners relating to the proposed Christchurch Central Electorate
- 114 counter objections were received. Including:
 - 560 petitioners relating to the proposed Waimakariri electorate
- 81 individuals or organisations appeared at public hearings in Auckland, Hamilton, Gisborne, Wellington, Nelson, Christchurch and Timaru.

2007 Representation Commission Final Electorate Boundaries Questions and Answers

1. How do the final electorate boundaries differ from the <u>proposed electorate</u> <u>boundaries</u> released in May 2007?

In summary:

In Auckland, the proposed Pakuranga, Howick, Manukau East, Hunua, Papakura and Manurewa electorate boundaries have been significantly redrawn. A new electorate of Botany, not Howick, has been created. The Pakuranga electorate remains largely unchanged.

The proposed Piako electorate has been renamed Waikato.

The proposed new electorate name Pare Hauraki-Pare Waikato is now named Hauraki-Waikato.

The proposed Rotorua electorate goes from a completely landlocked electorate to one that extends to the coast around Maketu

The Cook Ward of the Gisborne Distict Council has been retained in the East Coast electorate.

Waipawa has been put into the Wairarapa electorate

The electorates around Christchurch have become primarily urban. The Ilam electorate boundary has been changed.

The Banks Peninsula electorate has been revised and named Port Hills.

The Pleasant Point area has been kept with Timaru City in the Rangitata electorate.

Macrons have been added to 11 electorate names.

2. Why is the new electorate in Botany, not Howick?

Following the public objection process the Commission substantially redrew electorates in the Auckland area in response to feedback on the proposed electorates. The result of the redrawing was to establish the new electorate in Botany rather than Howick.

The Botany electorate centres on the Botany Community Board area.

3. When do the new boundaries come into force?

The next general election will be held under the new boundaries. Any by-election would be held under the existing boundaries.

4. How does an additional new electorate impact on the number of electorate and list MPs in Parliament?

There are currently 69 electorates – 62 general electorates and seven Māori electorates. For the next two general elections there will be 70 electorates – 63 general electorates and seven Māori electorates. While the number of electorate seats increases by one, the overall size of Parliament will not change. The number of list seats will reduce from 51 to 50.

6. When does the Commission review boundaries again?

The electorate boundaries are scheduled to be reviewed again in 2012.
